3. Approval of Meeting Minutes

3.1. The February 24, 2022, meeting minutes were reviewed and unanimously approved via email on March 3, 2022.

5.1. The committee reviewed a newly submitted registration, IBC-22-0076. The PI gave a summary of the project and answered the committee's questions. During discussion, it was determined that the registration required one addition, and that the Chair could approve the registration when this was completed. B.H. made a motion to approve the registration with

this caveat. B.C. seconded the motion, and the committee approved the registration with one abstention.

- 5.2. The committee reviewed a newly submitted amendment to IBC-20-0058 which adds three modifications to the previous IBC documentation. The PI gave a summary of the project and answered the committee's questions. K.C. made a motion to approve the registration. B.H. seconded the motion, and the committee approved the amendment with one abstention.
- 5.3. The IBC Chair updated the committee on the following registration that was reviewed since the last meeting: IBC-22-0075 was deemed exempt on April 11, 2022.
- 5.4. The IBC Chair updated the committee on the following amendment that was reviewed since the last meeting: IBC-20-0058 was reviewed and approved via DMR on March 23, 2022.
- 5.5. A deviation report was received from a PI on April 19, 2022, regarding IBC-20-0058. The group acquired and used material equivalent to, but not explicitly covered by, the approved registration. After immediate reporting to the IBC, the IBC Chair, Vice Chair, and RCM reviewed the report and determined it did not constitute a significant event and did not require further reporting to the institutional official or NIH/OBA; notifying the IBC satisfies the reporting requirement. The PI has put an internal process in place to try to mitigate the risk of deviations in the future when ordering and approving laboratory requests. The committee had no questions.
- 5.6. There were two Etiologic Agent Registrations (#322 and #323) that were received and distributed to the committee for their information. The committee had no questions or concerns.
- 5.7. IBC-15-0026 was closed on April 12, 2022. This work is continuing under new IBC registration IBC-22-0075.
- 5.8. The IBC was notified of a NBFAC bioforensic repository transfer of materials related to IBC-22-0074. The committee had no questions.
